AGE RULES

- Riders must be of legal riding age under WA road rules.
- Students under the legal age must not ride electric scooters on public roads or paths.

HELMETS ARE LAW

- A helmet is mandatory for all riders.

POLICE CAN FINE RIDERS

- Fines and other penalties apply for unsafe, illegal, or underage riding.

NO CHARGING AT SCHOOL

For safety reasons:

- Scooters and batteries must not be charged at school.
- Lithium batteries pose a fire risk if damaged or incorrectly charged.
